She also discussed the benefits of diversional therapy and supported her talk by interesting case studies.

During coffee the audience was presented with 'Social Management' slides 'Adding Meaning to My Day' from the Carunya Day Therapy Centre in the Illawarra and was then invited to examine the display of simple resources which can be used for diversion and occupation in caring for people with dementia. All of the resources displayed are easily obtained, low cost and designed to be used 'on the fly' by any carers of people with dementia.
